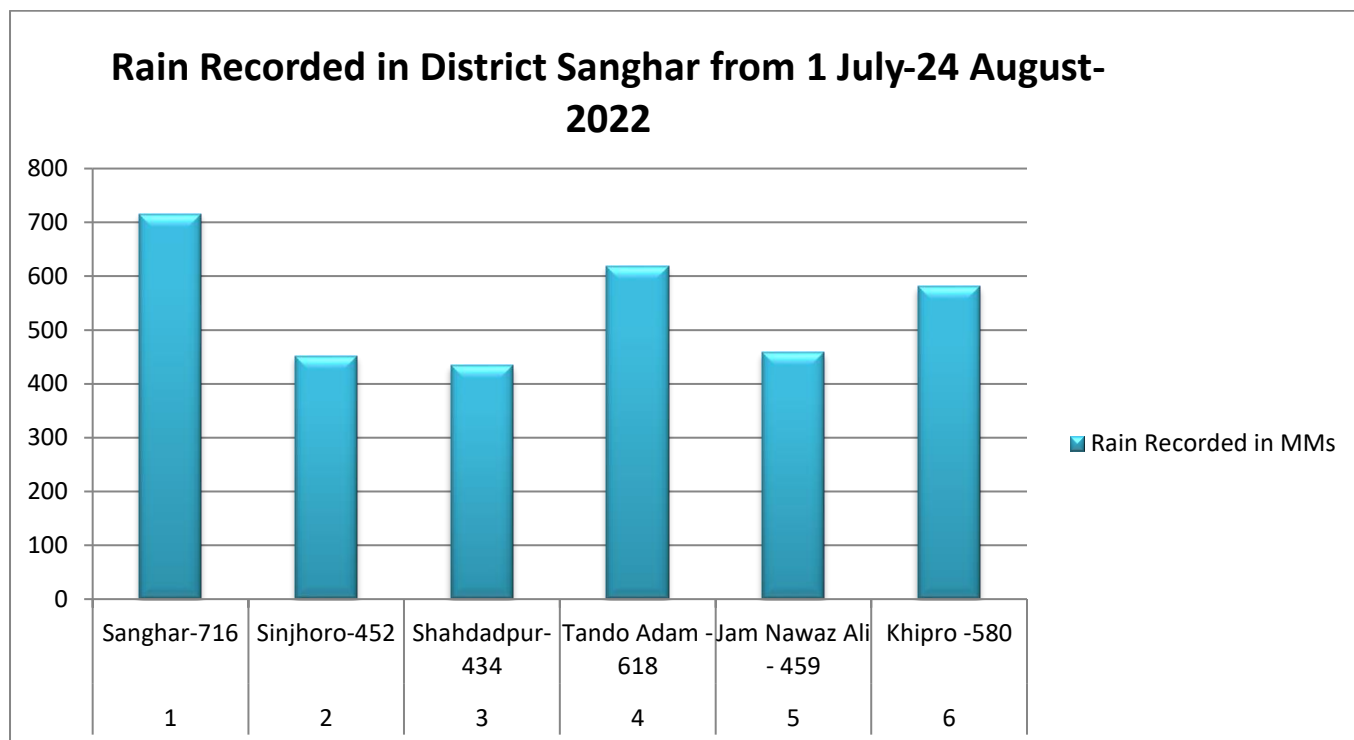

## **RAIN FLOOD/FLASH FLOOD -2022 EMERGENCY SITUATION:**

Heavy rains have resulted in urban and flash floods, landslides, and Glacial Lake Outburst Floods (GLOF) across the country, particularly affecting Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and Sindh provinces. More than 1 million people have reportedly been affected, mostly in Sindh (436,000 people), Balochistan (360,000 people) and Punjab (119,000 people) provinces. Compared to pre-monsoon levels, rainfall has increased by 267 per cent in Balochistan and 183 per cent in Sindh, causing substantial damage to lives, infrastructure and livelihoods. Flood affected several districts of Sindh. The destructive rains have resulted in more than 166 human casualties, 580 injured and enormous losses of crops, animals, household assets, government infrastructures etc.

## RAIN RECORDED IN DISTRICT SANGHAR:

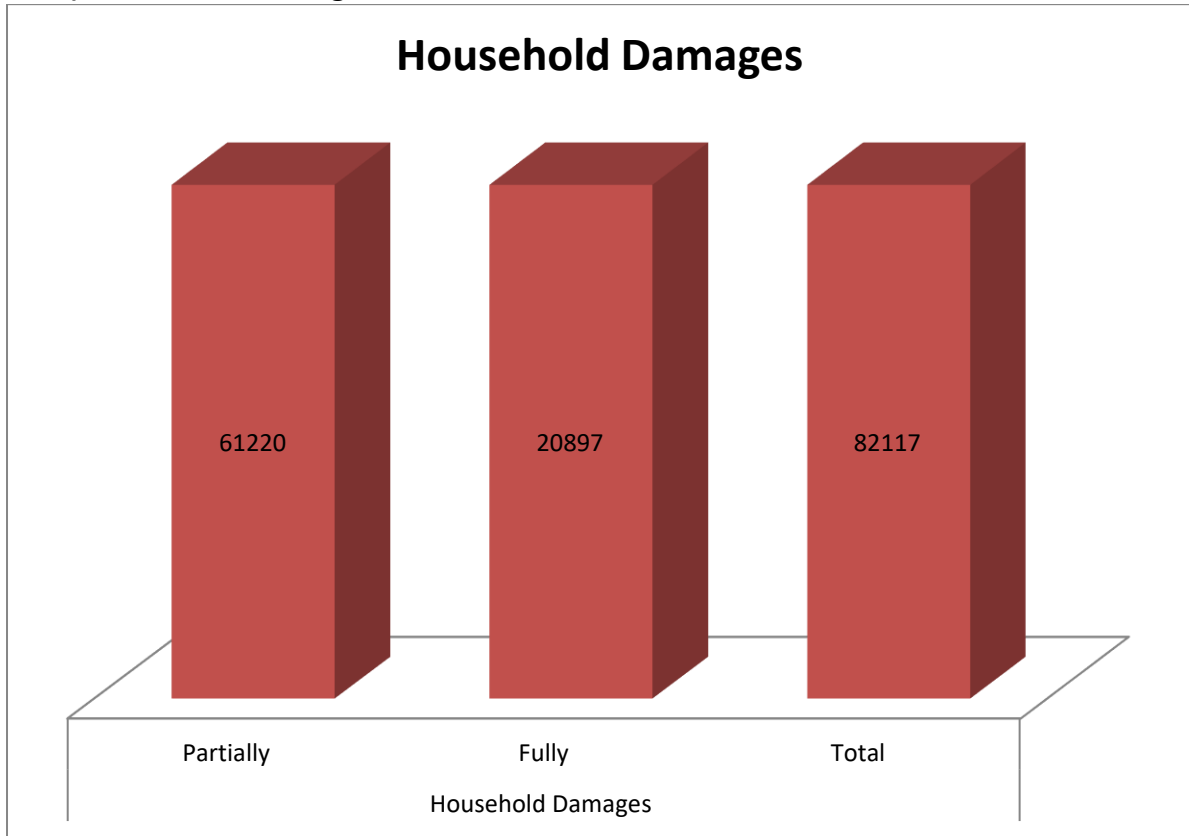

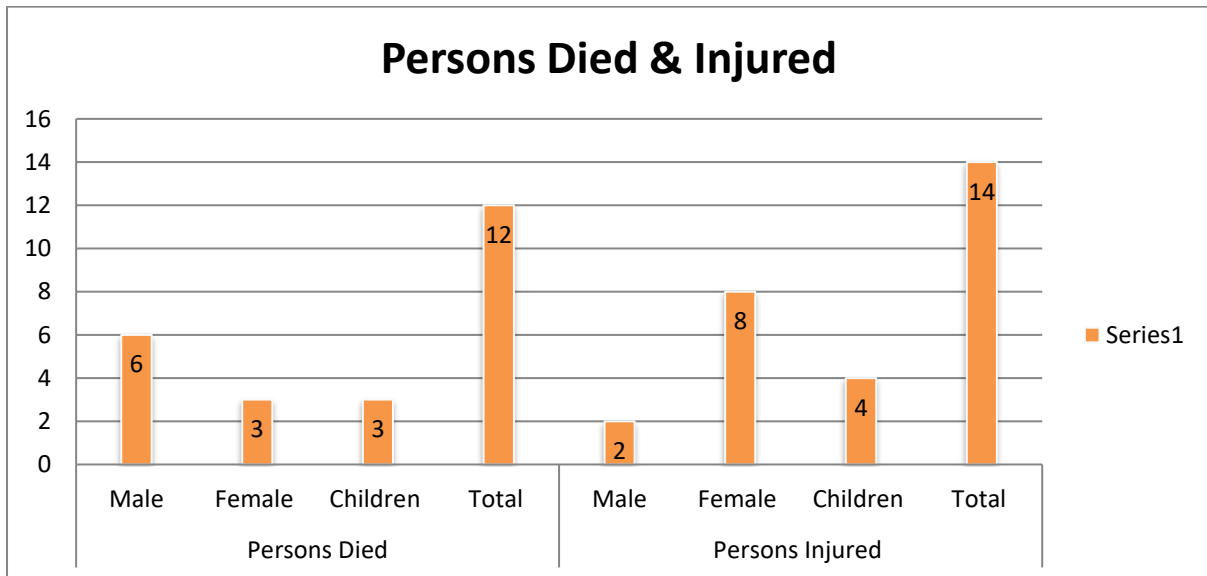
According to Pakistan Meteorological Department & District Administration Sanghar received rain in Taluka Sanghar 716 mm, Sinjhor 452, Shahdadpur 434, Tando Adam 618, Jam Nawaz Ali 459 and Khipro 580mm during the 1<sup>st</sup> July to 24 August-2022. This heavy rain bringing lot of troubles and losses of the houses, infrastructure like bridges, roads, canals, drainages and the crop in rural areas of Sanghar.

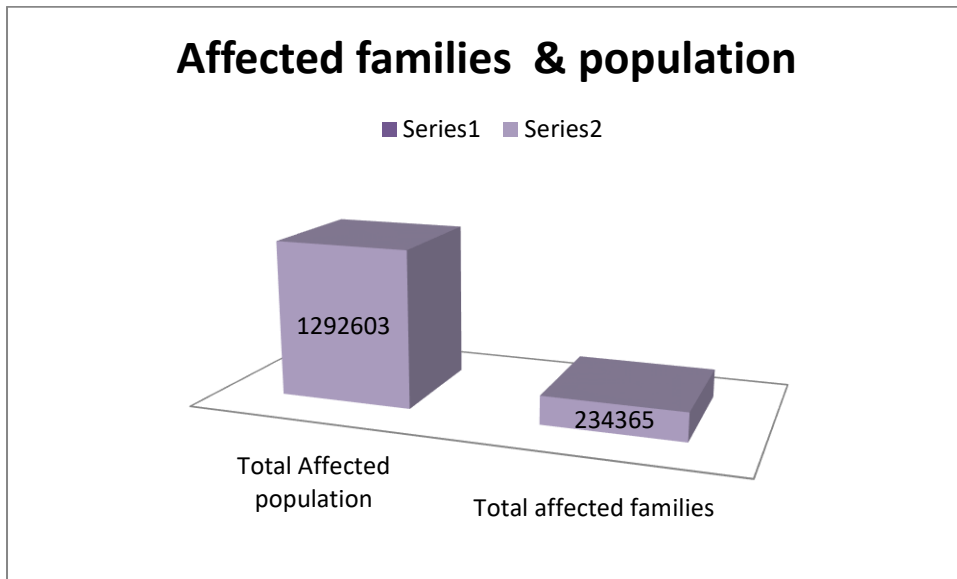

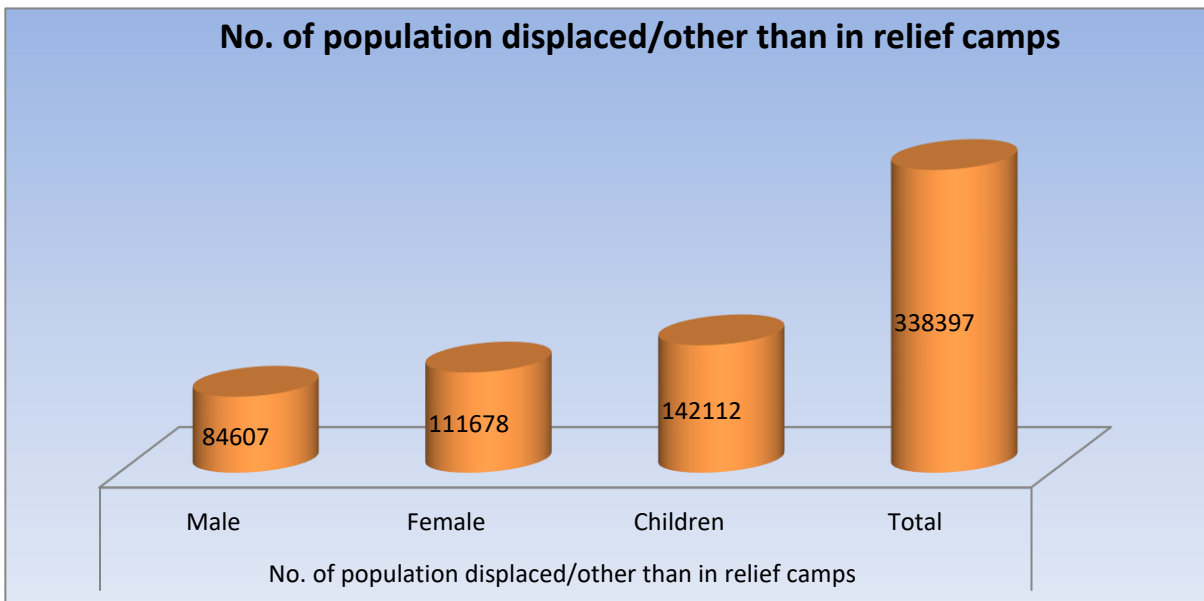
**b) Persons Died & Injured:**



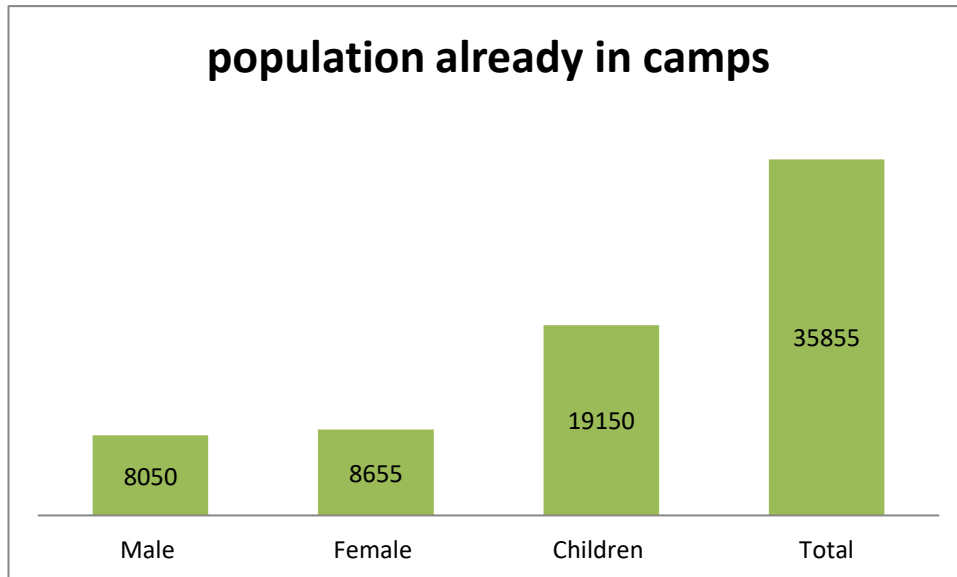
**c) Affected Families & population:**



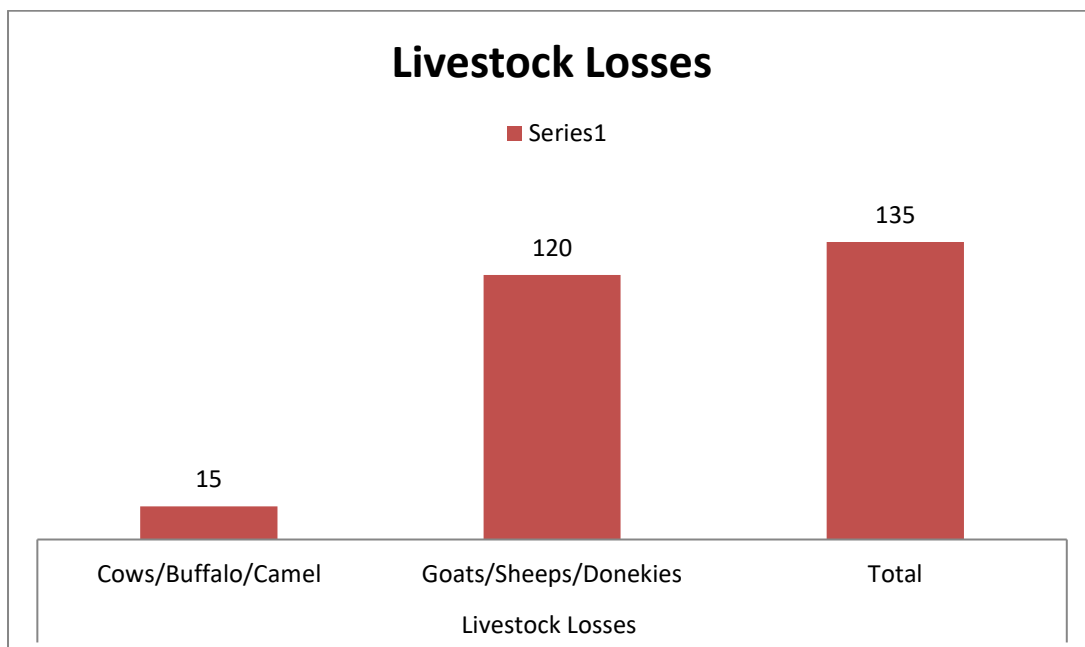
**d) No. of population displaced/other than relief camps:**



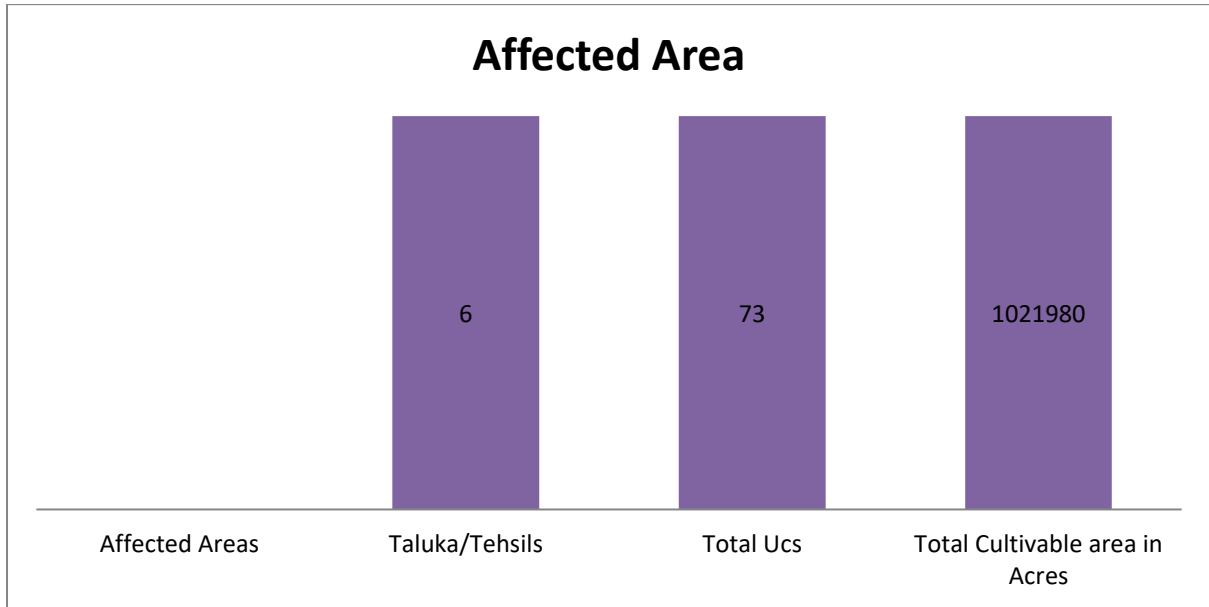
e) No. of population already in relief camps:



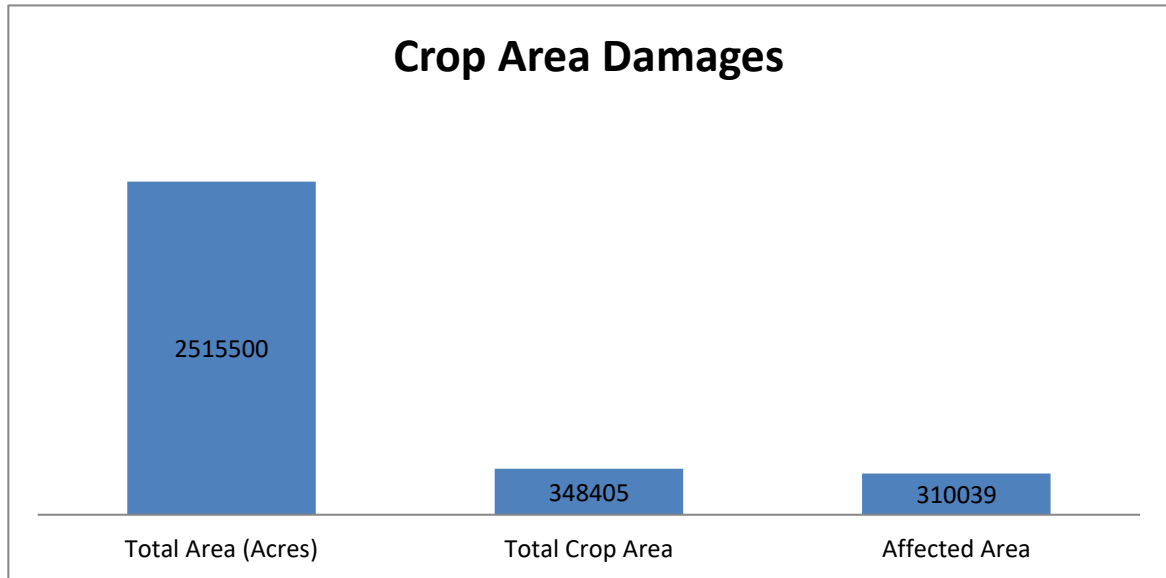

## **ANALYSIS BY ORGANIZATIONAL VIEW:**

Government has notified whole District (Means Six Taluka/Tehsils and 73 Union Councils) is calamity hit area. But according to our analysis the losses are double than reported by the Government Authorities especially losses of livestock and displaced population, damages houses and crop damages. Our team personally eye witness many losses for example one week previously when we visited from Sanghar to Chotiaryoon Road and travel 28 Kilometers, we saw and observed 57 donkeys and 25 goats has been died. It was only one little route of main road.

Other is main causes of the losses not natural but mismanagement by our authorities, many whole UCs like Shah Sikanderabad villages has drowned cut off land communications from many days but still no any support receive neither Government authorities nor any humanitarian organization. People have no access to the cities or towns as well as Government authorities searching way of communication or estimate the losses.

Sanghar District is drowned by the irrigation water and LBOD drainages Tando Adam City as well as Sanghar City and hundreds of the villages from Head Jamrao till Sanghar city drowned under water till 3 to 6 feet water, everything of those areas destroyed.

Thousands of families are displaced and wondering for searching safe places on road sides, along with bands of canals without any shelter, food, safe drinking water. Due to watering to every side mosquitos are increasing, diseases may spread and create any big disaster of human losses as well as animal's losses.

### **Urgently Required the Following Support:**

- i) Mosquito Nets for families as well as for their livestock's.
- j) Tents for shelter as well as shadow.
- k) Food Items (Rashan Packages) for two months to each family.
- l) Non-Food Items
- m) Medicines.
- n) De-watering from their houses/villages/cities.

### **Long Term Support required:**

- 1) Construction of their Houses.
- 2) Cash grant/support for livelihood and their survival.
- 3) Permanent planning for drainage water of the area through natural route of the water.
- 4) Construction of infrasture like Schools, Roads, Bridges, water Courses.
