This update is produced by National Humanitarian Network which aims to provide a brief overview of Mini Cyclone occurred in KP on 26 April 2015. The information below is provided by NHN KP/FATA chapter through NHN members, field visits, direct observations and key stakeholders including PDMA KP and district government departments in coordination with partner organizations from KP/FATA.

Speed of the Mini Cyclone

According to Pakistan Metrological Department (PMD) the speed of the Mini Cyclone was **110km/hr** (68 miles per hour) with **60mm rainfall**.

Affected Areas

In Gahdu Samarbagh, Wahid Gari, Nowshera, Charsadda, Liaqatabad, Sadiqabad, union council Mohib Banda and Ring road areas; number of billboards, polls and trees fallen/uprooted, many roofs and walls of houses were collapsed, hundreds of cattle have been killed and various standing crops were damaged. Beside this the storm also damaged communication and power supply system due to which most of the area fell in darkness.

Assistance Provided by PDMA

Till now 888 tents, 100 blankets and 250 food packages were provided by PDMA KP to the affected community.

Priority Needs

The priority need areas are:

- Removal of debris and rehabilitation/reconstruction of demolished roofs and walls of affected houses
- Emergency Food e.g. wheat flour, oil, rice, pulses, biscuits, tea, milk and sugar
- Non-food items i.e. tooth paste, soap, plates, glass and cooler
- Medical camps
- Most of the farmers lost their standing crops. So they need support in terms of seeds, potassium and urea to cultivate again their fields
